



IDENTIFIED HIGH RISK FACTORS (CONT)

PREVIOUS FRACTURE



Confirmed on X-Ray **

Investigate to identify cause of fracture: History and Examination FBC/Plasma Viscosity Biochemical (calcium and Alkphos) Testosterone and Gamma GT for males PSA for males

If other causes oxcluded see If other causes therapy notes suspected, refer and monitor appropriately bone density

** NB Plain X-Rays can show a fracture, however they are n a screening test for Osteoporosis, and they cannot exclude osteoporosis. Severe osteoporosis may be reported following an X-Ray as incidental finding, if so investigate as per confirmed vertebral facture above
