## In a nutshell

- **The GP Consultation in Practice:** things like phases of the consultation, consultation styles and skills; person centred care - patient's narrative, patient preference, holistic approach; ethnic/religious/cultural values; social medicine; ethical approach.
- **Patient Safety & Quality of Care:** delivering quality, clinical governance, safety culture, learning cultures & learning organisations; improving quality - identifying and reducing risk, looking at systems, processes and information systems; research & academic activity – audit, SEA, complaints, other projects and prescribing reviews.
- **The GP in the Wider Professional Environment:** strategic management; leadership & shared leadership; managing teams; looking after ourselves and our colleagues; the green agenda – looking after the environment, rationing, using resources economically and sustainably.
- **Enhancing Professional Knowledge:** evidence based practice – searching for evidence (internet, journals etc), critical appraisal, applying research, doing research; teaching and learning – you and others.

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
