
## Is it clinical audit?/CASC's 4 Step Guide






Start by asking Is the purpose of the proposed project to try and improve current care? Clinical audit is an improvement tool so your answer should be YES. As a minimum audit should seek to assure care.



Question 2: Will the project involve measuring current practice against agreed best practice (e.g. standards, guidelines, protocols, etc.)? For your project to be a clinical audit your answer to Q2 MUST be YES.



Question 3: Does the project involve anything being done to the patient that would not have been part of their routine management? If you answer YES to this question you may be conducting research. Audit focuses on routine practice.



Final question: Do the vast majority of your questions ask for quantitative (yes/no) answers as opposed to qualitative (free text) answers? If the answer is NO you are likely to be conducting a survey or non-audit project.
