INTRODUCTION

A copy of the article should be sent direct to Dr. Ridsdill Smith, Thornhills Medical Group, 732 London Road, Larkfield, Kent, M?O 6BG (Tel: 0732 843900).

It should be typed on A4 paper in double spacing with wide margins and on one side of the paper only.

Reimbursement for typing and postage costs will be made by the College.

AUTHORSHIP

- 1. Please give your name in your preferred form (ie. forename or initial). Your name should be located underneath the title of your article near the right margin. All articles should be dated.
- 2. Please will you write, on a separate sheet, up to fifty (50) words about yourself for publication. Qualifying medical degrees are omitted when there is a higher qualification such as MRCGP and so are diplomas.

TEXT

Please write as clearly and simply as you can, avoiding unnecessarily long words. Much confusion can be caused by headings and sub-headings and the importance of each relative to the others should be clearly indicated by a consistent system.

All references, tables and illustrations should be cited in the text. Tables and illustrations on separate sheets should be numbered consecutively and given captions/legends. Drawings should be"originals" (ie. not photocopies). Lettering should be clear and concise. If using previously published material you should get permission from the copyright holder.
